Many of the youth, however, found the festival-style rides in Octoberfest and Festa Italia, including the bumper cars, the teacups, the swings, and the catapult, more to their liking. Several in the group also tried their hand at the skill games, and a few lucky youth came away with large stuffed animals to bring home.

The group left the park at 8:15pm, and, after stopping for a late meal at McDonald's, returned to church around 10:00pm.
